ORDINANCE NO. 147-3/16 TO CREATE S.7.04(8) OF CHAPTER 7 ENTITLED "TEMPORARY SPEED LIMITS IN CONSTRUCTION ZONES" OF THE GENERAL CODE OF LA CROSSE COUNTY, WISCONSIN

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of La Crosse does ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 7.04(8) is created to read:

7.04 SPEED LIMITS.

(8) TEMPORARY SPEED LIMITS IN CONSTRUCTION ZONES.

(a) Pursuant to s. 349.11(10), Stats., the La Crosse County Highway Commissioner or his/her designee, may impose temporary speed limits for the safety of highway construction and maintenance workers, pedestrians and highway users, if the highway is being constructed, reconstructed, maintained or repaired and the highway is under the jurisdiction of the county or any state trunk highway upon which the county performs maintenance pursuant to s. 84.07, Stats.

(b) Such temporary speed limits shall be posted for the duration of the construction, reconstruction, maintenance or repair period and may be posted with signs on portable supports in accordance with state regulations.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect the day after passage and publication as required by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that, in addition to the above compensation, the elected officials shall also pay, as required by state law, 50% of the elected officials Wisconsin Retirement System contribution, and such changes from year to year as set by the state and WRS, and; **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the elected officials shall be eligible for voluntary health, dental and life insurance subject to the same terms and conditions as full-time non-represented La Crosse County employees. **FISCAL NOTE:** The estimated cost of salary for 2017 is \$4,044 and rollups \$628. All elected officials are contributing 6.6% to the WRS for 2016.

RESOLUTION NO. 86-3/16 RE: APPROVE OFFER TO PURCHASE BY VILLAGE OF ROCKLAND FOR 37 LOTS IN MEADOW PARK ESTATES

WHEREAS, on June 4, 2010, judgment was entered in La Crosse County Circuit Court vesting La Crosse County with an estate in fee simple absolute in 55 vacant lots in Meadow Park Estates located in the Village of Rockland as a result of the action for foreclosure of tax liens by proceeding in rem pursuant to Wis. Stat. s. 75.521; and, **WHEREAS**, La Crosse County had previously advertised the sale of the above vacant lots referred to as Phase I and Phase II, by publication of a Class 3 Notice in the La Crosse Tribune as required by Wis. Stats. s. 75.69 for the sale of tax delinquent real estate; and, **WHEREAS**, by previous resolutions in 2010 and 2011, the County Board Chair or County Administrator were authorized to accept the highest bid most advantageous to La Crosse County and all offers to purchase the lots in either Phase I or Phase II that remained unsold after the bids were closed, provided that every bid and offer to purchase on any lot for less than the appraised value of the lot shall be rejected; and, **WHEREAS**, by Resolution #71-1/16 the La Crosse County Board approved the sale of 3 additional parcels from the Meadow Park Estates addition for a sale price of \$5200 for one and \$5000 for the other two parcels after advertising the parcels for sale by publication of a Class 1 Notice; and, **WHEREAS**, since 2010 and 2011, the County has sold only 18 lots in total in the Meadow Park Estates, despite efforts to market the lots through a realtor; and, **WHEREAS**, the interest and penalty against the lots continues to accumulate, which means that the Village of Rockland will likely either not receive any share or only a reduced portion of the outstanding special assessments from the proceeds for sales occurring in the future; and, **WHEREAS**, the Village of Rockland has made an offer to purchase the remaining 37 lots in the Meadow Park Estates addition and desires to enter into a written agreement with La Crosse County regarding the purchase. **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the La Crosse County Board hereby approves the sale of the remaining 37 parcels to the Village of Rockland for the sum of \$76,394.09, by quit claim deed, which parcels are shown on the attached Exhibit "A". **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the County Board Chair and County Clerk are hereby authorized to execute any legal documents necessary to accomplish the sale of said properties in accordance with the terms of this resolution, after approval of Corporation Counsel. **FISCAL NOTE:** The total amount owing for the property taxes and specials purchased by La Crosse County for the 37 parcels is \$95,492.61 (real estate taxes: \$13,165.05 + settled special assessments: \$82,327.56 = \$95,492.61). The Village will be responsible for recording fees. The County will also be responsible for \$2500 negotiated realtor's commission and for title commitment expense of \$561.00. The County will write-off remaining unpaid taxes and special assessments regarding the parcels.

RESOLUTION NO. 87-3/16 RE: APPROVAL OF NEW GRANT AGREEMENT AND ADDITIONAL COUNTY FUNDING FOR EMERGENCY IMPROVEMENTS TO HINTGEN ISLAND FLEETING SITE

WHEREAS, there is a need for emergency maintenance due to erosion at the Hintgen Island Fleeting Site located in the La Crosse County Harbor area; and, **WHEREAS**, the State of Wisconsin has approved appropriating money for such site maintenance pursuant to Wis. Stat. §85.095(4), even though the property is located in Minnesota; and, **WHEREAS**, the State Harbor Assistance Program allows for the State of Wisconsin to provide grant money for harbor assistance for up to 80% of the non-federal share of the project costs; and, **WHEREAS**, the maintenance work consists of solidifying and shoring up bank protection by shaping and installing geotextile fabric, rock fill and rip rap on Hintgen Island; and **WHEREAS**, by Resolution #78-3/15 the La Crosse County Board approved a grant application and County funding for a state grant of up to \$376,000 and County match of up to \$94,000 to pay for the emergency maintenance work; and, **WHEREAS**, new surveys of the Hintgen Island area show that more rock fill material is needed to stabilize the Island, requiring an additional grant of \$108,288 for a total grant of \$483,640 and additional county match funding of \$27,072 for a total county match of \$120,910. **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the La Crosse County Board hereby approves a grant agreement for an additional \$108,288 from the Wisconsin Harbor Assistance Program and an additional \$27,072 in county matching funds for emergency maintenance for the Hintgen Island Fleeting Site. **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that County Board Chair is hereby authorized to sign any agreements and other required documents to effectuate the purpose of this resolution, after approval by Corporation Counsel. **FISCAL NOTE:** The additional county match needed of \$27,072 is not included in the 2016 budget. This amount shall be paid from the General Fund Unassigned Fund Balance, Acct. 100-33501. Lease revenue from the Hintgen Island Fleeting Site generates approximately \$13,000 to \$18,000 per year of net revenue.

The La Crosse County Planning, Resources and Development Committee, having considered Petition No. 1970 to amend the La Crosse County Zoning Ordinance filed by William D Strupp d/b/a Strupp Trucking Inc, N3567 Shiftar Rd, La Crosse, WI, 54603 o/b/o W&G Strupp Real Estate, LLC, N3567 Shiftar Rd, La Crosse, WI, 54603 and having held a public hearing on the 29th day of February 2016 for a petition to rezone 41.19 acres from the Exclusive and General Agriculture Districts to the Industrial District for continued and expanded operation of a sand pit to include an office, equipment shop, aggregate storage, truck scale, fuel storage, recycled aggregate stockpiles, and possible future concrete ready mix plant in the Town of Onalaska and described as follows: Part of the fractional NW/SW and fractional SW/SW of Section 18, T17N, R7W, and Part of the SE/SE of Section 13, T17N, R7W. Stats.: the Committee did publish and receive proof of a Class II notice of the hearing; did receive receipts of mailing of the notices to the affected Town Clerk(s); did hold a public hearing to hear testimony and official correspondence; and, did receive and consider action from the affected Town Board(s). The Committee, under s. 59.69(5)(e)4, and under s. 91.48(1), Wis. Stats., has the authority to approve the petition as submitted; to disapprove of the petition; or, to modify and approve the petition. Having considered the entire record the Committee's recommendation is to: By a vote of six (6) in favor, zero (0) no, and one (1) excused (Hesse), the committee recommended approval of Zoning Petition No. 1970 with no conditions. (if this petition is approved as a conditional zoning, deed restrictions must be recorded before zoning takes effect.) The County Board, under s.59.69(5)(e)5 Wis. Stats., has the authority to effectuate the petition by ordinance or to disapprove it. **The County Board** took the following action this 17th day of March, 2016. Approved the petition as submitted, becomes an ordinance.

CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT NO. 95-3/16 NO. 972 FILED BY WILLIAM D STRUPP D/B/A STRUPP TRUCKING INC, O/B/O W&G STRUPP REAL ESTATE, LLC, STRUPP SANDBOX, LLC, AND COULEE REGION RIDERS CLUB, INC, FOR OPERATION OF AN EXISTING SANDPIT AND EXPANSION OF THE SANDPIT INTO AN ADJOINING LOT, AND TO CONSOLIDATE ALL CURRENT AND PROPOSED SAND EXTRACTION SITES UNDER ONE CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT IN THE TOWN OF ONALASKA

The La Crosse County Planning, Resources and Development Committee, having considered an application filed by William D Strupp d/b/a Strupp Trucking Inc, N3567 Shiftar Rd, La Crosse, WI, 54603 o/b/o W&G Strupp Real Estate, LLC, N3567 Shiftar Rd, La Crosse, WI, 54603, Strupp Sandbox, LLC, N3567 Shiftar Rd, La Crosse, WI, 54603 and Coulee Region Riders Club, Inc, P.O. Boc 651, Onalaska, WI, 54650-0651 and having held a public hearing on the 29th day of February, 2016 for a Conditional Use Permit for operation of an existing sandpit and expansion of the sandpit into an adjoining lot, and to consolidate all current and proposed sand extraction sites under one Conditional Use Permit in the Town of Onalaska and described as follows: Part of the fractional NW/SW and fractional SW/SW of Section 18, T17N, R7W, and; Part of the NE/SE, Part of the SE/SE, and Part of the SW/NE of Section 13, T17N, R7W. Tax parcels 10-391-0, 10-395-1, 10-1449-2, 10-1452-1, and 10-1449-1. Property addresses N6172 and N6200 County Rd XX. Town of Onalaska. And pursuant to s. 59.69 Wis. Stats. and s. 17.36 Zoning Code: the Committee did publish and receive proof of a Class II notice of the hearing; did receive receipts of mailing of the notices to the affected Town Clerk(s); did hold a public hearing to hear testimony or correspondence from the people; and, did receive and consider action from the affected Town Board(s). The Committee, under s. 91.48(1), Wis. Stats., along with the affected Town Board(s), under s. 17.36(4), have the authority to approve the application with integral conditions or to disapprove of the application. Having considered the entire record the Committee's recommendation is to:

By a vote of six (6) in favor, zero (0) no, and one (1) excused (Hesse) the committee recommended approval of Conditional Use Permit No. 972 subject to the following fourteen (14) conditions:

1. Approval is granted specifically for a Conditional Use Permit for extraction and sale of sand from this existing sandpit and expansion of the sandpit into an adjoining lot, and to consolidate all current and proposed sand extraction sites under one Conditional Use Permit;
2. Conditional Use Permit No. 32 and any other county approved conditional use permits authorizing sand extraction from this site are hereby terminated and replaced by Conditional Use Permit No. 972;
3. This permit approval includes stockpiling and sale of recycled asphalt and concrete, bio-soil, clay, and topsoil as indicated in the application;
4. Any sand extraction within the 300-ft buffer of Halfway Creek and outside of the area approved under Special Exception Permit No. 2009-05 shall require that a special exception permit be approved prior to mining;
5. A berm shall be constructed on the applicant's property along County Road XX to effectively screen from view the mining and stockpiling activities from the traveling public. All berms shall be seeded so that vegetative cover is established and maintained;
6. This permit does not include the construction of a proposed concrete batch plant. The batch plant may be approved after rehearing and amendment to Conditional Use Permit No. 972 as a high volume traffic Conditional Use Permit under s17.04(3)(g) of the La Crosse County Zoning Ordinance. In lieu of an amendment to this CUP, a new Conditional Use Permit may be approved replacing and terminating CUP No. 972;
7. It is solely the applicant's responsibility to clean any material tracked onto County Road XX. Such material shall be cleaned off the road daily;
8. All truck loads with sand leaving the site shall be covered;
9. A list of haulers other than Strupp Trucking authorized to use this site, and excluding incidental sales, shall be provided by the applicant to the La Crosse County Zoning Department;
10. No blasting allowed;
11. Hours of operation are from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday;
12. Any other permits required by the La Crosse County Land Conservation Department shall be obtained by the applicant;
13. The owner/operator shall comply with all terms of NMM Reclamation Plan #2016-28; and
14. This permit is non-transferrable
