Administrator Report - Steve O'Malley PROCLAMATION APRIL 2018 - LA CROSSE COUNTY GOVERNMENT MONTH

WHEREAS, the nation's 3,069 counties serving more than 300 million Americans provide essential services to create healthy, safe and vibrant communities; and WHEREAS, counties move America forward by providing health care, administering justice, keeping communities safe, creating economic opportunities and much more; and WHEREAS, La Crosse County and all counties take pride in their responsibility to protect and enhance the health, welfare and safety of its residents in efficient and cost-effective ways; and WHEREAS, through National Association of Counties President Roy Charles Brooks' "Serving the Underserved" initiative, NACo is focusing on the critical role counties play in breaking multi-generational cycles of poverty; and WHEREAS, in order to remain healthy, vibrant and safe, America's counties provide public health, justice, safety, infrastructure, transportation, technology, environmental stewardship and economic services that play a key role in everything from residents' daily commutes to emergency response; and WHEREAS, each year since 1991 the National Association of Counties has encouraged counties across the country to actively promote their own programs and services to the public they serve; and NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the La Crosse County Board does hereby proclaim the month of April 2018 as National County Government Month and encourages all county officials, employees, schools and residents to participate in county government celebration activities.

Motion by S. Hampson/M. Giese to approve passed on a unanimous voice vote with 25 ayes, 4 excused - M. Larson, L. Pfaff, K. Tyser and T. Wehrs.

- County Land Ownership Inventory; History and Future Decisions
 - Current Inventory and Purpose Facilities Director Jim Speropulos gave an overview of the various properties that La Crosse County owns and their purpose. La Crosse County owns 2898 total acres excluding tax foreclosures and highway right of ways.
 - County Parkland and Lake Neshonoc La Crosse County has a total of 963 acres of forests and preserves, 1908 acres of parks, and 710 acres of leased land for Goose Island. The forest and parks include; Bice Forest 462 acres, Hoeth Forest 439 acres, forest preserves 62 acres, Mindoro County Park 114 acres, Swarthout Neshonoc Park 55 acres, Neshonoc South Park 60 acres, Lake Neshonoc 737 acres, and Veterans Memorial Park and Camground 232 acres.
 - Nursing Home and County Farm History Lakeview Administrator Wanda Plachecki overviewed the properties for the nursing homes and the history. In the 1800's there were three models; Poor Farm – Hillview Health Care Center, Mental Hospital – Lakeview Health Center, and a Specialty Hospital – Oak Forest (TB Sanitarium). In the 1970 – 1990's, many facilities closed or privatized in Wisconsin. There are only 35 facilities in 32 counties remaining today.
 - Economic Development and Lakeview Land Sales History Planner Charlie Handy reviewed the Economic Development and Lakeview Land Sales. Phase 1 of Lakeview Business Park started in 2002 with a mini TIF District. There was approximately \$2.2 million in initial development costs. Currently there has been 69.18 acres of land sold in Phase 1 with 8.42 acres yet to sell. The County and Village of West Salem signed a revenue sharing agreement allowing the County to serve as developer on the park using TIF incremental revenues for Phase 2. The TID district was effective in January 2007.
 - o Future Decisions Future decisions to be made include clarifying the role of the County: Land Owner, developer and local governmental partner. Next steps for Phase 2 of Lakeview Business Park include transferring operations of the park to tenants, storm water, utilities and planning, Lake Neshonoc dredging

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and public access. Potential residential developments with redevelopment of old Lakeview, Tilson Street and Appleshore area.
