- Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Insight Report Chanin Kelly Rae reported.
  - This assessment will deliver leadership insights; policy, process and procedure S.W.O.T analysis; internal culture assessment; external culture assessment; and a 5 year strategy roadmap. Feedback from 47 out of 49 leaders in La Crosse County Government was gathered to acquire a more comprehensive understanding of La Crosse County's objectives, preferences, and tactics. The top five key drivers demonstrating strengths from the perspective of county leaders include leadership commitment, collaboration and communication, employee engagement and satisfaction, community engagement and outreach, and diversity recruitment and retention. The top five key drivers demonstrating growth opportunities from the perspective of county leaders include lack of awareness and understanding, inadequate resources and support, limited accountability, resistance to change, and need for education and training. The next steps will include the S.W.O.T analysis, staff survey and listening sessions, community survey and listening sessions, and then strategic planning with leaders and stakeholders.

# RESOLUTION NO. 6-5/23 RE: FORMATION OF THE LA CROSSE COUNTY BROADBAND COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, as result of the La Crosse County Board of Supervisors adopting resolution #35-12/22, La Crosse County was certified by the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin as a Telecommuter Forward! Community in 2023; and WHEREAS, as a result of the La Crosse County Board of Supervisors adopting ordinance #201-01/23, La Crosse County was certified by the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin as a Broadband Forward! Community in 2023; and WHEREAS, in 2023, La Crosse County elected to participate in the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin's Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Local Planning Grant Program; and WHEREAS, to be eligible to apply for and receive BEAD Local Planning Grant Program funding, La Crosse County must form a Broadband Committee with the intent to, among other responsibilities, develop a county-wide vision and goals, perform stakeholder engagement, identify barriers to broadband infrastructure projects, provide direction to staff and other engaged parties, and ensure digital equity for all La Crosse County residents. NOW, THEREFORE BE IT **RESOLVED**, that the La Crosse County Board hereby authorizes the formation of the La Crosse County Broadband Committee (LCBC); and **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the La Crosse County Board Chair shall appoint a LCBC of up to 15 members (hereinafter "the Committee") to develop a county-wide vision and goals, perform stakeholder engagement, identify barriers to broadband infrastructure projects, provide direction to staff and other engaged parties, and ensure digital equity for all La Crosse County residents. **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Committee shall provide regular progress reports and receive policy direction from the Planning, Resources and Development Committee on established vision and goals, results of stakeholder engagement, identified barriers to broadband infrastructure projects, and progress reports for broadband infrastructure projects. FISCAL NOTE: No fiscal impact. Any recommendations from the Broadband Committee with a fiscal impact will require County Board approval.

# RESOLUTION NO. 7-5/23 RE: APPROVAL OF REQUEST FROM THE TOWN OF CAMPBELL FOR RELEASE OF \$500,000 TO CONDUCT ADDITIONAL RESEARCH TO ASSIST IN FINDING LONG-TERM SOLUTIONS TO REMEDIATE PFAS CONTAMINATION

WHEREAS, Per-and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS), a "forever chemical" was located in Town of Campbell wells in 2020; and, WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Health has issued a health advisory recommending a safe interim water source of bottled water for the entire Town population; and, WHEREAS, as part of the 2023 budget, the La Crosse County Board of Supervisors pledged \$500,000 as a placeholder to provide assistance to the Town of Campbell in conducting additional research for a safe and sustainable long-term water solution; and, WHEREAS, the Town of Campbell has conducted a feasibility study, drilled a 500-foot test well below the contaminated ground water aquifer, beneath multiple layers of protective rock, into the deep Mt. Simon aguifer, and has worked with and continues to work with local, state and federal organizations to determine the best long-term viable solution for a safe and permanent water source; and, WHEREAS, in its continued study of best options to provide safe water, the Town of Campbell is exploring the creation of its own water system; and, WHEREAS, the Town of Campbell has requested the release of \$500,000 to conduct additional research for a safe longterm water solution which will lay the groundwork to receive state and federal grants. **NOW THEREFORE** BE IT RESOLVED, the La Crosse County Board hereby approves the request by the Town of Campbell to release \$500,000 to conduct further studies to aid in finding long-term solutions to remediate PFAS contamination. FISCAL NOTE: The 2023 budget provided \$500,000 funding for the Town of Campbell to continue its study on a long-term water solution from budget line item 100.155.1450 (64200.10)

# RESOLUTION NO. 8-5/23 RE: APPROVE USE OF AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARPA) FUNDING FOR SKILLED TRADES TRAINING

WHEREAS, La Crosse County was allocated \$22,923,224 through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, which must be obligated by the end of 2024 and spent by the end of 2026; and, WHEREAS, the County Board has reserved funding for eight project priority areas as outlined in Resolution #55-1/22 including \$2.45 million for Skilled Trades Training; and, WHEREAS, labor shortages in the skilled construction trades slow and increase the cost of important public and private projects in La Crosse County and weaken our local and regional economy; and, WHEREAS, as La Crosse County does not have the capability to develop and maintain a skilled trades training program, a Request for Proposal was released on March 6, 2023 asking for community partners to propose a model for skilled trades training; and, WHEREAS, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater La Crosse presented a proposal to 1.) provide space for training, coaching and transportation. 2.) Collaborate with organizations such as school districts, technical colleges, the construction sector, and labor unions, to educate young people on skilled trades career paths that lead to productive and well-paid jobs and 3.) Create a local program that works to promote and increase enrollment in existing skilled trades programs that support local industry for at least ten years; and, WHEREAS, community partners, including the City of La Crosse, School District of La Crosse, Couleecap, Kwik Trip and the La Crosse Area Builders Association have indicated support for this model through letters of support. NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the La Crosse County Board approves \$2 million of American Rescue Plan Act funding for the funding of a skilled trades training program; and, **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, prior to release of funding, a memorandum of understanding will be approved by the Executive Committee outlining roles and responsibilities between the Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater La Crosse and La Crosse County regarding the development of a skilled trades training program. FISCAL **NOTE:** Costs totaling \$2 million will be tracked in division 295.770.3744 within the County financial system, Account 64100.02.
