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RE: FUNDING FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

WHEREAS La Crosse County residents are served by nine Emergency Medical Services (EMS) or joint EMS-Fire departments; and

WHEREAS, these nine local agencies are in need of training regarding Naloxone and other FDA-approved drugs to reverse opioid overdoses; and

WHEREAS, the La Crosse County Sheriff’s Department, La Crosse County Health Department, and La Crosse County Human Services Department have the ability to apply for Naloxone, Narcan, or any training to reverse opioid overdoses; and

WHEREAS, depending on the needs/request of each agency some of these funds may be allocated out of the opioid litigation settlement money; and

WHEREAS, La Crosse County has received approximately \$2.4 million in opioid settlement monies;


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that \$5,000 (\$45,000 total) shall be set aside for distribution to each of the nine EMS units for Naloxone or other FDA-approved drug to reverse opioid overdoses and other needs approved under the terms of the opioid litigation settlement.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that EMS agencies can seek reimbursement of up to \$5,000 so long as the EMS agencies provide a request for reimbursement of funds; and



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that prior to reimbursement, EMS agencies shall seek assistance from the County Health Department and Sheriff’s Department; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these funds shall be set aside for six months and if unallocated after six months shall be returned to the county’s opioid settlement fund.

FISCAL NOTE: If the use is allowed under the terms of the opioid settlement agreement funds, funds will be allocated out of the County’s Opioid Settlement dollars which are tracked under division 296.220.1000 in the County financial system.


